Communications Working Group Report, April 6 2024 GM, submitted by Lisbie Rae

The Digital Skills project is now complete. The New Horizons for Seniors Program gave us a grant of almost \$25,000 to improve the digital skills of our members. Over the last year, we paid Connected Canadians to train VG4A mentors, deliver 6 I-pads with training in their use, and run 10 well-attended Zoom workshops. We also purchased sound equipment that allows us to hear each other better at indoor meetings and at outdoor meetings, without the need for power or sound cables. Laurie and Lisbie will write and submit the final report required by New Horizons and make it available to members by request.

Feedback from members about our partnership with Connected Canadians has been very positive. As a lasting legacy of this year's work, the digital skills team reminds all members to tell their friends about Connected Canadians, as any senior in Canada can request a session on Zoom with a Connected Canadians volunteer to answer questions they have about how to use their devices. Many thanks to the digital skills team of Joyce, Sandra, Lisbie, and Tracy for guiding the project to a successful conclusion.

The monthly workshop series was so popular that we have decided to continue it ourselves, beginning in May; more details will follow soon.

The on-going work of the Communications team includes producing the March and April newsletters, updating the website and VG4A's Facebook page, handling publicity for the African Dinner and collaborating with the Cycle Tour Working Group to plan publicity for this year's Cycle Tour. A separate team has been investigating how to archive VG4A's records such as photos, videos, minutes and newsletters. To comply with tougher laws governing collection of data, another team is expanding VG4A's policies on protection of privacy. These changes will be brought to the membership to read ahead of the next GM.

Grandmothers Regional Liaison (GRL) Report, April 6 2024 GM, submitted by Bonnie Yarish

Suko Bhebhe is the new development officer for the Grandmothers Campaign. She was born in Zimbabwe and came to Canada 10 years ago. She has a background in African studies and development and experience with volunteer management, youth and community engagement and social mobilization. Niambi gave a financial overview presentation – power point is available

- Grandmothers to Grandmothers Campaign raises around 20% of the SLF's revenue every year which is one of the largest sources of funds for the SLF.
- Legacy giving is a growing part of funding and helps in planning for the SLF's longevity.
- For the first half of the 2024 fiscal year there is a total of \$5 million raised with a goal of \$8 million by the end of the fiscal year. The Grandmothers Campaign accounts for 24% of that.
- The SLF and other non-profits have seen a trend of a decline in major gifts and a reduction in gift amounts because of the economy.
- Even though the number of active grandmothers groups declined during COVID the revenue raised remains about the same.
- SLF is hoping to institute avenues to communicate with people who donate to grandmothers groups but do not donate a second time.

Grandmothers trip to Africa

- Suko is coordinating organizing this trip with support from the Programs and Development team. Uganda and Tanzania will probably be the countries visited.
- The tentative date is Spring 2025.
- The SLF is putting together a comprehensive brief to provide more information about the trip and are hoping to share details in the April Granny Bulletin.

Speakers Bureau Update

- SLF will take the lead on: current stats and messaging regarding HIV and AIDS; collecting media materials; create basic presentations with stories about grandmothers; FAQ document
- Looking for members to update materials that give tips on giving presentations and recruiting talented speakers from within their regions to be consultants and trainers.
